MBR caught up with Janice Fiorentino, one of the directors along with Daniel Micallef and Daniel Camilleri from (X,Y,Z) Architecture & Design after they picked up Malta's Best Architect award during the recent Malta Real Estate, Property Development & Architecture Awards 2021.

MBR: As one of the directors and architects of (X,Y,Z), can you tell us how critical is your role to engage in business strategy and how does it operate to be most effective given your size and scale?

JF: In our industry, size and scale determine the kind of projects you are able to take on. Our strategy over the years evolved given also the evolution and growth of the industry during the last 8 years. Efficiency means good professional service, which at the end must be countered with adequate and equivalent compensation. Clients looking for a detailed professional service appreciate this, since it's reflected in the end result.

MBR: How do you describe (X,Y,Z)'s culture and how critical is culture to the success of your organization?

JF: Our office culture is based on simple yet crucial ingredients – efficiency, reliability, teamwork, and flexibility. Office culture is derived from the characteristics of the

team members. We are lucky to have a great team of professionals, working in synch with each other on different aspects of projects, whilst as a company our policy has long been to offer a flexible and healthy environment for our team members. Our industry is stressful, demanding and involves a lot of players, with us as architects having a leading role in getting different people to work together. As we see it, our office culture helps us deal effectively with the challenges we face daily whilst carrying out our profession.

MBR: Will you discuss (X,Y,Z)'s commitment to diversity and how important is it for (X,Y,Z)'s workforce to mirror the diversity of the communities and industries it serves?

JF: As a company we have worked on a wide range of projects, with local and foreign clients; from intimate residential projects to large corporate offices for multi-national companies, to social housing, homeless
